FROM THE DIRECTOR:

2015 was a very exciting year for Inside Prison Ministries. Our efforts to share hope through music and the message of Christ was returned to Him in a very powerful way. Our team continues to witness changed lives, surrendered hearts, hope, and a sense of restored purpose to many who once believed there was no hope. We are yet finding that **music**, is one of the most powerful and effective tools in bringing this message to light in prisons. In this year of uncertainty, there is certainty in this; Jesus is still on the throne, and all hope is found in Him.

We were blessed to have a great number of volunteer/visitors join us this year. What

a joy to know that many from the "outside church" can encourage those who don't know Christ, as well as those from "inside (prison) church" simply by their presence. Prisoners are amazingly appreciative that someone from the outside, would give of their time for them. Also, when individuals



submit their lives to God in prisons, it often produces behavioral changes, thereby an overall positive difference in the prison system. Therefore, violence is lessened, moral is increased, and this makes the work load for prison officials and officers much less. **The word of God is our hope** and offers salvation to prisoners. Many of them have never understood or internalized this truth.

However, prisoners across the state of Michigan are drawn to this hope and positivity because of a negative past or environment.

There were approximately 365 men in attendance singing, worshipping, raising hands and praising God. Asked how many father's were in attendance, over 85 percent raised their hands 12 men gave their lives to Christ....AMEN!

Imagine...

The first time you walk through the heavy rounded by barbed wire fences. The prissteel doors of a prison, it leaves you with on towers once occupied with fully



a strange feeling. Hearing the loud clang as it slams shut behind you, gives you since of helpless-

ness. There's no going back. You are in prison, a place no one wants to be.

The guard behind the plated glass window passes a device through a small opening. He tells you to strap it to your waist and says "If someone tries to harm you, don't hesitate to use it".

As we walk across the yard, we hear yelling from prisoners, we try our best to tune it out. Our eyes scan the view and we see hundreds of men dressed in blue and orange. We are now completely sur-

rounded by barbed wire fences. The prison towers once occupied with fully armed guards are now empty because of state government cuts.

Once we get inside the gym where the concert will be held, things begin to change. We come face to face with what society deems the most dangerous criminals. We try not to think about what crimes these men may have committed as it might consume us with fear or even disgust. We then look into the faces of the prison church members that greet us,

because of the Lord, they are our brothers, the body of Christ.

"This is when we begin to see what Jesus sees in the eyes of the hopeless".

They welcome us with sincere gratitude.



They are eager to help and treat us with great care. As the music starts, we see prisoners begin to

praise God. We also see a deep emptiness in the eyes of those who don't know God, not only physically locked behind bars but spiritually bound by sin. This is when we begin to

see what Jesus sees in the eyes of the hopeless.

They have only come, to get out of their cell or to hang out with friends. They are carrying a load of guilt and shame. Most have their heads down looking at the floor or their arms crossed, unreceptive, not sure what to expect.

Once Wayburn begins to sing, in time, they begin lifting their heads as the songs of hope and message of forgiveness move them.

Now, all across the gym you see hands lifted toward heaven. Some are dancing, some kneeling and there are others who have their faces buried in their hands, weeping and shaking at the story of God's Son coming to earth to save them from

When we return to share with them again, this time as we walk across the yard, we still hear yelling, but instead they are calling out our names, "brother Wayburn, sister Janae, were coming to the concert... we can't wait...thank you for coming back...

We thank God for this incredible opportunity. Music is our key, the inmates are opening the door to Jesus.
